














The P-shape conservatory combines a mix of Edwardian or Victorian styles and is ideal for creating maximum space while keeping a sense of proportion in the property.






Gable Conservatories are an ideal way of adding a touch of luxury to your home. The shape and design allows for more room to be added to the home while allowing light to flood in.


#### **SOLID ROOF**


## Patio Doors

## 1. Quotation

## **5. Planning Permission**

Usually planning permission is not required as a conservatory is a 'permitted development'. (We can carry out the planning permission process on your behalf if required.)
